

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
November 10, 1986

President Gilefski called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M. Commissioners present were Walter P.J. Gilefski, James S. Evans, A. L. Jones, William Hartzell and Daryl Tull.

Guests present were Police Chief John Tyndall, Town Manager Clif Laverty, Alderwoman Connie Collins, Sewer Plant Manager John Loscomb, Mr. Donald Jones, Barmeta Smith, Linda Brenman, Jerry Johnson of Jones Dairy, Cairol Brown of Jones Dairy, Attorney Doug. Marshall representa RAPA, Hazel Harris, Reporter George Graves, Fred Frye and Samuel Waller.

A motion was made by Commissioner Tull, seconded by Comm. Hartzell to dispense with the reading of the minutes of last month's meeting. Approved by the Board.

A motion was made by Comm. Hartzell to dispense with the reading of the special meeting of October 27, seconded by Comm. Tull. Approved by the Board.

Bills in the amount of \$21,886.55 were presented for payment. A motion was made by Comm. Jones, seconded by Comm. Evans to accent the bills as presented. Approved by the Board. Conv of the bills is attached hereto.

President Gilefski said he had talked to Mr. Joseph Evans on the one regarding the itemization estimate of crop damage when the water loop was installed. Mr. Evans said he had averaged the barley per acre, plus fertilizer, etc., and he felt the \$250.00 he was requesting would still put him in the hole. Comm. Hartzell made a motion to pay Mr. Evans his original request of \$250.00. The motion failed for lack of a second. A motion was made by Comm. Tull to pay \$175.00 to Mr. Evans; seconded by Comm. Evans for the inconvenience of his crop damage. The vote was Gilefski, Evans and Tull for the motion; Jones and Hartzell nay.

There were two water bill adjustments; Mr. George Steinmetz--a motion was made by Comm. Hartzell to adjust the bill to the average of last two bills; seconded by Comm. Evans. Approved by the Board. Peggy Bayliss--Comm. Hartzell made a motion to adjust the bill to April's bill with a registered letter to be sent to Mrs. Bayliss that this will be a final adjustment. The Commissioners will allow no more. The motion was seconded by Comm. Evans. All Commissioners voted yea except Commissioner Tull who voted nay.

President Gilefski read for the 2nd reading a revised conv of the ordinance on fences and other visual obstructions. The motion was made by Comm. Hartzell; seconded by Commissioner Jones to accent the ordinance as read. Approved by the Board. A copy of the ordinance is attached.

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President Gilefski said Del-Agra had requested to reimburse the Town for the cost of damages incurred from the whole lima bean spillage into our facilities, in lieu of the fine imposed by the Town. A motion was made by Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Tull to send an itemized bill for the inconvenience and clean-up of the lima beans, including labor and over-time cost in lieu of the fine, with the fine still recorded on our records. All Commissioners approved the motion except Comm. Hartzell who voted nay.

President Gilefski read the proposed changes to the waste water discharge permits for RAPA and Del-Agra. Drafts of the proposed permits will be sent to the two industries for their study of such at the very earliest date. If approved and accepted the permits will be issued and copies attached to next month's minutes.

President Gilefski introduced Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Brennan who would like to open a teen center in Klein's Department Store building. Mrs. Smith said the center would have video machines, food services, pool tables, weight lifting area and a study area. It would be open from 3:00 to 7:00 P.M., giving the students a place to go between school and school sporting events. Mr. Gilefski and the Board gave them their blessings but reminded Mrs. Smith of a yearly license fee for pool tables.

Mr. Sam Waller was introduced by President Gilefski. He, too, was interested in Mr. Tuck's store for a barber shop and Mrs. Hazel Harris as a beauty shop. Again the Commissioners gave them their blessings and told them any other building zoned commercial would be acceptable.

President Gilefski called for Commissioner's reports.

WATER DEPT--Commissioner Evans said he wanted to thank Mr. Laverty and John Loscomb for allowing their men to install the water meters.

STREET DEPARTMENT--Commissioner Hartzell said that a couple of pot holes around town needed repairing and pot holes on Jacobs Street will be repaired by C.O. White where he had opened it to install water line.

POLICE DEPARTMENT--Commissioner Jones said he wanted about 5 minutes in executive session due to personnel.

SEWER DEPARTMENT--Commissioner Tull has nothing at this time.

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ALDERMAN REPORT--A copy of Mrs. Collins' report was presented to each Commissioner. Approved as presented.

TOWN MANAGER REPORT--Contract A bid opening will be at 2:00 P.M. at the Town Hall. (November 11, 1986) Mr. Lavery said 58 out of 60 meters have been installed. Two Private Haulers permits have been issued. One new application came in today. New building permits are being printed. Mr. Lavery said he was waiting on grant for new well. President Gilefski said he was assured by Secretary West that the money for a new well would be granted. Commissioner Tull made a motion to authorize President Gilefski to sign any contractorial agreements; seconded by Commissioner Evans.

Citizen's Privilege. Mr. Frye wanted to know when the parking lot across from his restaurant would be paved. President Gilefski told Mr. Frye that the Town had leased the land from the State for two years, but if the State did not pave it, The Town did not have money to do so. Rep. Barnes had told the Commissioners that he had money to pave it. Unloading signs on Mechanic Street will be removed at Mr. Frye's request.

Mr. Donald Jones asked the Commissioners permission to dump into the plant on Saturday, Sundays and holidays as that is when he had his most business. He said he would provide a cooler and test samples at his cost. Mr. Loscomb said he would personally allow Mr. Jones to do so. Commissioner Tull does not foresee any problems with this. Permission granted.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hartzell, seconded by Commissioner Jones at 9:10 to go into executive session.
