

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
NOVEMBER 12, 1979

Meeting was called to order at 8 P. M. by President Robert Mulvaney.

Commissioners present: Mr. Al Jones, Mr. Earl C. Willey, Mr. William Hartzell, Mr. James Evans and Town Manager, Ron Wilson.

Guest present were: Walter Gilefski, Charmine Culver from The Seaford Leader, Barry Johnson and Mr. & Mrs. Della-Ferri.

Minutes of last regular meeting were read. Motion was made by Al Jones to accept same as read. Seconded by Earl C. Willey and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney read a thank you note from T. J. Gray, Jr. for the plant that was sent to him while he was a patient in the hospital.

Mr. Mulvaney gave a report he received from Dawson Shahan, Jr. about Rapa Scrapple's BOD's. It appeared there was little change since last month's report. They had sent the town a letter stating an Engineer had been hired by them to help correct their problem. The Board felt perhaps some progress was being made. Mr. Mulvaney said a copy of this report will be sent to Rapa.

Mr. Mulvaney read a letter signed by all the residents on Elm Street requesting that something be done to improve their street. Mr. Earl Willey Street Commissioner, stated that work will be started within one week. A letter will be sent to advise them of this action.

There was a discussion about cutting lots in town without the owner's consent. Mr. Hartzell said we should enforce the Ordinance we now have on keeping lots cut or make a new Ordinance.

Ron Wilson, told the Board that Dennis Schrader, town's attorney and he would get together and make necessary changes in Town Charter to bring it up to-date for our needs.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Barry Johnson about his former residence that was burned several months ago. The Board would like to see this cleaned up. Mr. Johnson said he hoped to get settlement from the Insurance Co. soon and he would keep the Board informed.

Mr. Mulvaney read a letter from Melson Brothers stating they would start November 13 to repair the ceiling in the Meeting Room. Bill Coverdale will run a by-pass for the down spout.

It was suggested Ron look into the cost of a humidifier to absorb moisture in the meeting room. Mr. Mulvaney read a letter from Clark Carbaugh apologizing for poor services that he felt we had in the past. This was in answer to a letter Mr. Mulvaney had sent him. We will have a complete report on the Sewer Plant and 201 Program very shortly.

The affirmative action plan developed by Mr. Wilson was adopted by Town of Bridgeville for hiring personnel. This must be done for Federal Funding-motion made by Mr. Hartzell to accept this plan, seconded by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney said Martin Ruddick was checked into concerning their desire to build Town Houses in Bridgeville. His Company was found to be in

good standing and project was given approval by the Board, subject to a meeting with Farmers Home Administration representatives to discuss any technicalities that may arise.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Mr. Hartzell what had he come up with on checking water meters and flat rates for water use and which would benefit the townspeople best. Sewer charges must also be planned to meet the cost of operation of the Waste Treatment Plant. Mr. Hartzell said each household should get a card to fill in any plumbing facilities they might have and when they come back to the town, he could get a more accurate figure to work with.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Mr. Evans if he had anything to report from the Water & Sewer Dept. He said he did not.

Mr. Mulvaney asked if Mr. Jones had a report from the Police Dept. Mr. Jones reported there was 74 traffic arrest, 21 criminal complaints, 10 criminal complaints cleared, 43 public assists and 3 accidents. The police covered 3,630 miles and worked 689 hours.



Mr. Mulvaney read a letter from the Dept. of Labor concerning Ted Bishop a former employee. Town's Attorney, Dennis Schrader had received this and sent it to the Town. It was decided the Board would meet with Mr. Schrader very soon to discuss what action should be taken concerning the matter.

Meeting adjourned at 9:50 P. M.
