Motion was made by Earl C. Willey that all bills be paid.

Willey that a letter be written to Mr. Harvey Dickerson, President of The Town Board of Greenwood, to advise him that no more prisoners be put in our jail. Seconded by T. J. Gray, Jr. After this, Mr. Lynch thanked Mr. Kinder for coming to the meeting and he then departed.

There was a discussion of the budget of the departments and the work that is now being done on the sewers and the streets. It was noted that the electric bill at the Fire House was high and it was decided that a letter be written to Mr. Richard Thomas who is President of the Fire Company and ask that they be a little more conservative.
