

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE  
REGULAR MEETING  
NOVEMBER 9, 1981

Meeting was called to order at 7:10 P. M. by President Robert L. Mulvaney.

Commissioners present were: Robert L. Mulvaney, A. L. Jones, Walter P. J. Gilefski and James S. Evans.

Guests present were: Bonnie Grant of the Leader, Leanne Phillips of Cross Roads Section of the News Journal, Mrs. Hattie Sylvia, Alderman Margaret I. Thompson, Chief of Police, Ricci B. Pyle.

President Mulvaney moved to dispense the reading of last month's minutes, approved by the Board. Motion was made by Walter Gilefski and seconded by A. L. Jones to pay bills in the amount of \$14,014.66. Approved by the Board. Bills here attached.

An amendment to the regular meeting minutes of July 13 and August 10, 1981 was read by President Mulvaney and approved by the Board. This amendment here attached.

Pres. Mulvaney asked the Board's permission in the absence of Street Comm., William Hartzell due to illness, to look into the matter of installing a new storm drain in the alley running in back of Mrs. Hattie Sylvia, Senior Citizen Center and H. C. Layton's. Mr. Walter Gilefski made a motion to allow Pres. Mulvaney to attend to this matter seconded by James Evans and approved by the Board. Pres. Mulvaney advised Mrs. Sylvia that the Town Engineer, Cabe Associates, would be asked to draw up the specifications for this project and contracts would be put out on bids in the near future. He also said that money would be available from the County by the end of the month to add to money from the Municipal Street Aid fund projected for the project. Amount of money from the County will be \$5,000, \$3,500 will go toward the new storm drain and \$1,500 will go the Police Department for general operation.

President Mulvaney brought to the attention of the Board a complaint of Mrs. Ruth O'Neil concerning her water bill, which she felt was too high. After some discussion, it was decided that she pay the bill as presented and if January's bill reverted back to her previous bills a fair adjustment would be made.

Pres. Mulvaney asked Sewer Commissioner Walter Gilefski if he had an update on the 201 Facility Plan from Cabe Assoc. Mr. Gilefski said he had contacted Mr. Clark Carbaugh of Cabe Assoc. and was told that all reports would be ready by the end of November. Mr. Carbaugh would like to meet with the Comm. to explain his findings on this report before they read it themselves and then schedule a public hearing.

Pres. Mulvaney reported to the Comm. that with their support a public hearing on the proposed sewer project projected by the state would be held December 3 at the Bridgeville High School. The Board agreed to the hearing.

President Mulvaney said he was very disappointed in the press in their reporting of the rat situation in our Town. He and the Board felt it had been blow out of proportion by the Press.

Water Comm. James Evans told the Board that 12 new water meters had been purchased and were being installed. He said that Mr. Coverdale said it would take 1200 ft. of a 6 inch line at a price of \$8,100 for labor and material to run water lines to the new housing project. He said most major water repairs have been made except for the fire hydrant near Smith's Packing House which will be done by bad weather.


Mr. Jones, Police Comm. told the Board that on Oct. 30, 1981 Otis H. Holloway was hire as a full time policeman for the Town. He said he was chosen afer interviewing 20-21 applicants. Mr. Jones said extra cars were used for Halloween therefore using more gasoline than last month. He told the Board that React helped the Town policemen with 14 men Halloween keeping down crime and mishief. He asked the Board to allow him to send a \$50.00 donation to React for their free time and assistance. This request was granted. His report for the month shows: 15 complaints, 99 traffic arrests, 2 accidents, 1,530 miles traveled, 165 miles patrolled, 361 hrs. worked and 16 total assists.

Alderman, Margaret Thompson, said here had been 97 fines collected during October for \$4,057.60 plus \$135.00 from Court 4. This was a decrease from Oct, 1980 of \$1,844.50. Court costs for the month os Oct. were \$807.50 and the Violent Crime Compensation tax totaled \$337.60.

Sewer Comm. Walter Gilefski told the Board that Cabe Association first presentation on final state of 201 Facility Plan would be Dec. 1, at 7:30 P. M. He also told the Board that tax letters to delinquent taxpayers were being mailed out by Town Solicitor, Dennis Schrader on schedule.

Regular meeting adjounred at 7:40 P. M., Commissioners to go into executive session.
