

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
OCTOBER 12, 1981

Meeting was called to order at 7:10 P. M. by President Robert L. Mulvaney.

Commissioners present: A. L. Jones, Walter Gilefski, James Evans and Robert Mulvaney.

Guests were: Chief Ricci Pyle, Alderman Margaret Thompson, Mrs. Hattie Sylvia and Mrs. Bonnie Grant of the Leader.

Motion was made to dispense reading of last month's minutes by Pres. Mulvaney and seconded by Mr. A. L. Jones.

Bills in the amount of \$8,884.33 were approved for payment by the Board. Bills here attached.

Halloween was discussed and it was decided that trick or treat night would be on Saturday, Oct. 31, due to a home football game on Friday night. Hours will be 6-8 for children 12 years old and younger. Anyone over 18 will be off the streets by 11 P. M. Extra people will be hired to cover the two nights.

Pres. Mulvaney told the Board he had talked to a representative of Case Edwards Construction Co. This representative will be in Bridgeville within 2 weeks to answer any questions the Commissioners might have. Pres. Mulvaney asked the Commissioners to have any questions they might have ready when the representative makes his visit. President Mulvaney said he was told there would be 24 Town Houses - 40 % will be subsidized or 13 Town Houses.

President Mulvaney introduced Mrs. Hattie Sylvia to the Board and guests. Mrs. Sylvia asked the Board when she could expect the drainage system from R. R. Ave. & Layton Alley to the storm drain on Market St., to be started. She was under the impression it was going to be done in July. Pres. Mulvaney told Mrs. Sylvia he was aware of her problem, but could not tell her why it had not been done. The money is available to do the work and he would let her know when work would be started by the end of the week.

Pres. Mulvaney asked for the Commissioner's reports.

Alderman Thompson gave the following report: There were 105 fines processed through the courts for the month of September. From March 1, 1981 to September 30, 1981 998 fines had been collected compared to 535 fines for the same period in 1981. September fines totaled \$4,461.50 \$841.50 of which was Court Costs and \$340.50 was Victim Compensation Tax.

Police Commissioner reported the following: There were 79 traffic arrests 18 Complaints, 5 Accidents, 1,518 miles traveled, 132 miles patrolled, 443 hours worked, 12 assists, 388.15 gals of gasoline used, 285.15 gals. by the Police and 103 gals. by the Sewer Plant. Chief Pyle said there had been a rash of car thefts and vandalism in the later hours of the night. It will be decided by Comm. Jones and Chief Pyle about hiring another policeman and working later hours.

Mr. James Evans, Water Commissioner gave his report. He said the work on Delaware Ave. had been completed and he hoped that the work on the fire hydrants near Smith's packing house and on Jacobs St. would be started promptly. He said he needed to order 10 more water meters and he hoped to soon find out why the relay electrical system was not operating properly. He had called Delmarva Drilling to check out the electrical system. He also said an altitude meter was needed to be installed to regulate the filling of the new tower.


Sewer Comm., Walter Gilefski told the Board that DelAgre went over their limit last month and was charged accordingly. He said he was waiting for a report from Clark Carbaugh on the Facility Plan. Time is getting short on deciding what to do about NDPS permit.

A motion was made by Mr. Gilefski that names and addresses and amounts of all delinquent tax payers up to the present date be published in the paper. After much discussion this motion died for lack of support. Mr. Gilefski then made a motion to collect all collectable delinquent taxes by Solicitor, Dennis Schrader. This was seconded by Al Jones and approved by the Board.

Al Jones moved that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Walter Gilefski.
