

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
OCTOBER 13, 1980

Meeting was called to order at 7 P. M. by President Robert L. Mulvaney.

Commissioners present were: Robert Mulvaney, James S. Evans, William L. Hartzell, Alfred L. Jones and Walter Gilefski.

Guests present were: Mr. Bradfor Barnes, Mrs. Margaret Thompson, alderman, Police Chief, Frank Galante, Carol Dongarra of the Leader and Mrs. Nellie Rich.

Secretary James Evans read the minutes of last month's meeting. Mr. Walter Gilefski made a motion to accept minutes as read, seconded by Mr. William Hartzell and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked if anyone present would like to make any comments. Mr. Bradford Barnes said he would like to present a Certificate of Appreciation to the Board for the donation they gave to the Newton-Records Softball Team. This certificate was very gratefully accepted.

President Mulvaney asked Mrs. Rich if the Board could assist her in anyway. The said her driveway has too much of a slant and some of her customers were having to have their exhaust and tail pipes adjusted after driving over her driveway. Mr. Evans is to contact Mr. Crockett to see what has to be done and get an estimate immediately.

President Mulvaney told the Board that he had been in contact with Mr. Burowski of the State Energy Conservation Office; Mr. Browski to make free to the town, an audit of their energy needs and how to save on same.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Mr. Jack Wozniak to advise the Board about the resolution for the Town of Bridgeville to establish a town energy conservation policy. This would have to be adopted before the Energy Office could make their audit available. Mr. William Hartzell moved that the resolution be adopted, seconded by James Evans and approved by the Board. Resolution here attached.

It was agreed to by the Board that a lot purchased with HUD monies on Church St. joining Rosie Williams house be sold to her for the amount of \$1500.00. Mrs. Williamd to be advised of this by letter.

A letter from Mrs. Marjorie Anderson was read inquiring about purchasing the lot joining her. Mrs. Anderson to be informed by the Town that they do not own this property known as the Evans property. Therefore the Town is not in a position to negotiate on this property.

Halloween will be observed on Friday, October 31, 1980 from 6-8 P.M. for children 12 years old or under. This to be published in the Leader for two weeks.

President Mulvaney said a letter to the Red Star Company stating that we cannot furnish water and sewer lines out to their property. Mr. Hartzell made a motion to grant permission to write this letter, seconded by James Evans, approved by the Board.

Bills were presented for payment in the amount of \$16,4303.64. Motion

made to accept and paid bills as presented. Bills here attached.

A letter will be sent to Keel's T.V. regarding their bill for T.V. rental. This bill will not be paid until he can show a signed contract for this rental. Future reference on this to be handled by Town Solicitor, Dennis Schrader.

Water Commissioner, James Evans told the Board that he had ordered 80 new meters which are being installed as quickly as possible. Mr. Evans said he felt that Mr. Guy McClary should not have to pay for the new water line to his house that was being installed. He told the Board that Delmarva Drilling would get together with them soon on pump operation including electric work.

Street Commissioner, Hartzell said that 5½ tons of cold patch had been used to patch streets. He wanted a one way, do not enter street sign erected behind Jeff's Taproom.

There was a discussion on giving Revenue Sharing money to the Bridgevill Fire Co. It is hoped that the Board can give them more money if possible.

There was also a discussion on preparation of next year's budget.


Police Commissioner, Al Jones gave his report of 77 assists, 3595 miles traveled, 613 gals. of gasoline used, 284½ hrs. worked, 252½ hrs. patrolled, 120 arrests, 19 complaints, He also told the Board part-time patrolman, Paul Viehman had to leave the force because of ill health. He said new traffic signs were being erected.

Alderman, Margaret Thompson gave her alderman's report for the month. She also told the Board she was being sued by an offender she had fined and who's license has been revoked. She was told to talk to Dennis Shrader, Town Solicitor.

Walter Gilefski, Sewer Commissioner, gave his report. A discussion was brought up about purchasing a different dump truck to haul sludge to the dump. He also said Clark Carbaugh will be making a survey of the sewer needs for EPA Project in Town of Bridgeville.
