

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 10, 1979

Meeting was called to order by President Robert Mulvaney at 8 P. M. on Monday September 10th. Present were James S. Evans, William Hartzell, Earl C. Willey, Town Manager, Ron Wilson, Linda Hammond from the Seaford Leader and Mrs. Hattie Sylvia.

Minutes were read by Mr. Evans of last regular meeting. Earl C. Willey made motion to accept minutes as read. Seconded by Al Jones and approved by Board.

Bills amounting to \$10 302.54 were presented for payment. After discussion about various bills they were approved for payment by the Board. Bills here attached.

Ron Wilson told the Board that the mower at the sewer plant was beyond repairs. He had talked to Mr. Root and was advised not to spend any money on repairs for it. Earl Willey made a motion to buy a new mower in the future. This was seconded by James S. Evans and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked if there was anything from the floor. Ron Wilson read a letter from Mrs. Sylvia about how water came in her home from a recent heavy rain that we had. Mrs. Sylvia, being present, ask that something be done to carry water away in back of her building. Earl Willey told her he would look into this matter and get a grade to see where the water was coming from. Mr. Mulvaney thanked Mrs. Sylvia for coming.

Mr. Evans told the Board that Charles Smith has his sewer tap made as he requested at the last meeting. Mr. Evans said he had no report from the Sewer Plant, things seemed to be doing fine. Mr. Al Jones said he knew of a certified sewer plant operator who would give us his assistance if we needed him.

There was a discussion about the Southern Housing Codes that Ron Wilson looked into and felt that the town needed to adopt, so they would have some control over what we should have in buildings. Mr. Mulvaney suggested each Commissioner read an Ordinance that was prepared by Mr. Wilson and our Town Solicitor. They will get back with this at another meeting.

Ron Wilson had a meeting with two men about a new HUD Program. It is a long range project. It could be as high as \$125,000 for the Town. We will advertise of our intentions in the paper Sept. 20 and 27th. Motion made by Al Jones that we accept this new program. Seconded by Earl Willey, approved by the Board. William Hartzell made motion to make Ron Wilson Project Director, seconded by James S. Evans.

There was a discussion about R. & P. Adams waste. On August 22 they were sent a letter asking them to proceed immediately to take necessary steps to correct their BOD concentration. In answer to this letter Rapa stated they were working on a plan to take care of this but it would be about 12 months before it would be completed. Cabe Associates our Consulting Engineers suggested more tests, but the Board felt many had been done through the 201 Facility Plan and we should proceed in another direction. This has been delayed at least six years.

The Board felt that Ralpa Scrapple should pay more for sewage. Motion was made by William Hartzell that we charge a flat rate of \$1200.00 per quarter, as long as they are not in compliance, seconded by Al Jones. It was decided that Ron Wilson will call on Ralph & Paul Adams and express the Commissioners wishes. The Board also will turn the matter over to Dennis Schrader, The Town's Attorney, to proceed with action with 90 days or a daily fine.

There was a letter read by Ron Wilson which was a request for underground telephone cable on east side of Gum Alley. William Hartzell made motion that this be allowed, seconded by James S. Evans and approved by the Board.

There was a letter from McDowell Oil Co. thanking the Board for their donation of \$200.00 to help with the expenses of their trip to Binghamton N. Y. for the Softball Tournament.

Mr. Hartzell asked Linda Hammond about the picture she took of the traffic on 404 this summer. It appeared in the Leader. He said there was no way to control the flow of traffic through town this summer. The police do the very best they can.

Being no further business, meeting adjourned at 9:30 P. M.
