

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 8, 1980

Meeting was called to order at 7 P. M. by President Robert Mulvaney.

Member present were, Robert L. Mulvaney, Al Jones, William Hartzell, James S. Evans and Walter Gilefski.

Others present were plant manager, Jack Wozniak, Town Alderman, Margaret Thompson, also Mr. Robert Thompson, Frank Galante, acting Chief of Police, George Savaste from CATV of Harrington, Mr. Merrill from the Delaware Citizen's Committee and Carol Dongarra of the Leader.

Secretary James Evans, read the minutes of last meeting. Al Jones made motion that minutes be accepted as read, seconded by Walter Gilefski and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked Mr. Merrill to present his request to the Board. In order to get the channel they wanted they would like to use our water tower for a translator. Mr Savaste from CATV said this would not interfere with the reception that we have now. They said they would pay for their power.

Mr. Hartzell made amotion that we give Town space for their station if it did not interfere with the Town's reception. This was seconded by Al Jones and approved by the Board.

Mr. Mulvaney asked for reports from the Commissioners.

Mr. Evans, Water Commissioner said he had ordered 80 new meters and we had 24 new ones on hand. All old ones will be replaced. Mr. Evans had pictures made of all pumps and gages showing how they operate. He also had a map of the location of the water lines in town and the different colors that showed the sizes.

Street Commissioner, William Hartzell said that he is trying to keep all pot holes filled and they will be checked regularly. There was some discussion about Mrs. Nellie Rich's driveway and Mr. Evans said that she had talked to him about it. Mr. Hartzell said he had been over there and it did not seem to bother his car. Mr. Evans said he would look into it.

Sewer Commissioner, Walter Gilefski said they completed new shed and will be moving in. He also stated that George Reinsfelder will not come on a weekly basis as he has been doing for several months, but come only as needed. New classes will start in the Spring and Jack Wozniak plans to attend to prepare himself for a Sewer Plant Operator. Mr. Hartzell asked if the State checked our discharges from the plant and Jack said we were in good shape. The State in the month of August made no test.

Mr. Al Jones, Police Commissioner said Ron Wilson the Chief of Police had resigned effective September 5, and Mr. Frank Galante was named acting Chief. He also stated that John Marvel would be made a Lieutenant . There were 176 traffic arrests, 9 criminal arrests, 25 criminal complaints, 14 criminal complaints cleared, 85 public assists, 3 accidents, 3,859 miles traveled and 893 hrs. worked.

Mrs. Thompson gave her alderman's report.

Mr. Mulvaney read Ron Wilson's letters of resignation and it was accepted by the Board. Motion made by Mr. Hartzell and seconded by Walter Gilefski.


Bills amounting to \$20,290.18 were presented for payment. Motion made by Mr. Evans to pay all bills and seconded by Al Jones. Bills here attached.
