

COMMISSIONERS OF BRIDGEVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 9, 1974

Meeting called to order at 8:00 P.M. by President Powell.

All commissioners are present. Visitors were Mr. F. Joseph Willey, Chief Kinder, Bryant Richardson, Irene Jefferson, Afha Williams, Rev. Byrd, Susan Howes and Josephine Weal.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. F. Joseph Willey asked the Board for a variance to park a house trailer on a lot he owns next to T. G. Adams & Son, Inc. No action taken at this time.

Rev. Byrd requested that the town become involved in the Bridgeville Senior Citizens Club. Wants another building to be used as Senior Citizens Center. Rev. Byrd wants a meeting with citizens as a whole. Funds cannot be allocated until the program is integrated. State funds cannot become available because of existence of another club in the Sussex Area. The club has not been able to acquire a board of directors. The club needs money and a public meeting to get the program off the ground. President Powell has offered the Town Hall as a meeting place. Money could not be funded as no budget was submitted with Rev. Byrd's plan. Some funds could possibly be available, but major funds cannot be available as it is just not possible. Ms. Howes asked town to have a public meeting and select a board of directors. President Powell promised cooperation.

Motion made, seconded and duly approved proposal of Bridgeville Cemetary Asso. per attachment excepting the water line be increased from 1 1/2" to 2 inch.

President Powell informed the board that CATV Bridgeville has not filed for FCC approval. Letter to CATV General, which is attached, was read by President Powell. This letter was written by the town soliditor, Betts & Lee.

President Powell read letters from Human Services Commission dtd. 8-4-74, Del. American Revolution Bicentennial Commission dtd. 9-3-74, and Division of Mental Health dtd. 9-3-74. Letters attached.

Motion made, seconded, and duly approved ordinance declaring loitering and lounging on streets. Copy of ordinance is attached.


